## **‘MAJIK NETWORK’ LAUNCHES NEW WEB SITE**

*Former Packer Quarterback Don Majkowski Connects with Fans in Exciting New Way*

**Milwaukee, WI (May 16, 2005)** – Former Green Bay Packer quarterback Don Majkowski has launched a new web site focusing on his career as an NFL analyst. The site also allows fans to share memories of his days leading the Green and Gold. The new web site address is [www.majiknetwork.net](http://www.majiknetwork.net).

“I get back to Wisconsin a lot these days, covering the Packers in my new role as an NFL analyst,” said Majkowski. “People here have been very receptive to me and I really appreciate that. I am often asked what it’s like to make the transition from NFL player to working in the media. I’ve also been approached to make a number of personal appearances to sign autographs and speak to various groups. I’m really enjoying my new career and this site offers a comprehensive look at everything I’m up to.”

Extremely popular with Packer fans, earlier this year the ‘Majik Man’ joined WSSP SportsRadio 1250 in Milwaukee as a contributing NFL analyst providing expert commentary on the Packers and the NFL. Majkowski appears regularly in the morning with Chuck Garbedian and in the afternoon with Peter Brown. Majkowski also writes a regular column for the *Packer Report* newspaper, offering his insights on the game from the perspective of a former NFL quarterback. Last season, fans saw and heard Majkowski in Wausau on WAOW-TV’s “Pack Attack,” across north-central Wisconsin doing radio analysis on WSAU-AM, and from Lambeau Field with sideline reports for WITI-TV Fox 6 in Milwaukee and WLUK-TV Fox 11 in Green Bay.

Majkowski, who played in Green Bay for six seasons (1987-92), is poised for induction into the Packer Hall of Fame on July 23. He finished his Packer career as Green Bay’s fifth all-time passer, completing 889 passes for 10,870 yards and 56 touchdowns. In 1989 Majkowski led the Packers to 10 victories (their most in 17 seasons) as he earned Pro Bowl honors by throwing for 4,318 yards, six 300-yard games and 27 touchdowns.
